## 43 Say it nicely

**Level:** Intermediate and above

**Target Group:** Young adult / Adult

Type of activity: Vocabulary extension

**Preparation:** Make copies of the

handout on page 115 – one copy for each

student.

This activity highlights a small, but interesting (and amusing) area of vocabulary.

## Method

- 1 Give out the handout and ask the students to read through it silently.
- 2 Check pronunciation of difficult words: euphemism / handicapped / disabled / physically challenged / differently abled
- 3 Ask the students to list other words for **restroom** in pairs or as a group. Make a list:

men's / women's / ladies' / gents /

gentlemen's

toilet / lavatory / WC (water closet)

loo (British), the john (USA) – both

informal

powder room (women, USA), bathroom

## **Euphemistic expressions:**

May I be excused? / I'm just going to wash my hands. / Where's the bathroom? / I'm just going to powder my nose (women, old-fashioned)

toilets / parts of the body / negative qualities / polite ways of saying unpleasant things – especially death, killing, war

Note that dividing the list into noun (help), verb (pass away, terminate) and adjective will help.









A **euphemism** is a polite way of saying something. In English there are many words for **restroom** (which is a euphemism). They are nearly all euphemisms. The problem with euphemisms is that we always need new ones. As soon as the euphemism becomes well-known, another one is needed.

For example, 20 years ago the word **handicapped** was used. It was replaced by **disabled**. This was then replaced by **physically challenged**. Some people say this is too negative, and prefer **differently abled**. You still see disabled on signs.

Do you use euphemisms in your language? What things do people use euphemisms for?
