
## Possession


## Remember that we have different ways to show possession in English.



## Showing possession

We can show possession with an apostrophe + s, or we can use the possessive adjectives.





## Remember the possessive adjectives

We use possessive adjectives with nouns.

The possessive adjective is the same for singular and plural nouns.

This is *my* book.

This is your book.

This is his/her/its book.

This is our book.

#### **Possessive** pronouns

A possessive pronoun takes the place of the noun.

We can use possessive pronouns when we don't need o mention the thing that we possess.

This is John's book. > It's *his*.

This is Sarah's car. > It's hers.

This is your book. > It's *yours*.

This is Peter and Stept

#### Possessive pronouns

When we use the possessive pronouns, we don't mention the thing that is possessed.
