

Purpose of the room?

Each room has a specific purpose. Each room is designed for different actions. (Verbs)

What is a **verb** again?

A verb shows an action or a state of being.

The past tense is when an action (verb) has been done. It is over! There is a simple rule to change the verb from present to past, you just add (ed) to the verb.

Present

Past Verb + (ed) = Verb(ed)

However there are some verbs that do not follow this pattern. These verbs are called 'irregular verbs'.

rest / rested



sleep / slept



wash / washed



get ready / got ready



cook / cooked
